

**ORDINANCE 02 - 2019**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FORT WRIGHT, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, DISSOLVING THE PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD AND REPEALING SECTIONS 97.15 AND 97.16 OF THE FORT WRIGHT CODE OF ORDINANCES**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to KRS §97.030 and Ordinance 9-03, the City of Fort established the Fort Wright Parks and Recreation Board (the “Parks and Recreation Board”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Parks and Recreation Board is currently vacant; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Fort Wright has determined that it is in the best interest of the City of Fort Wright to dissolve the Parks and Recreation Board; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF FORT WRIGHT, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION I**

That the City of Fort Wright hereby dissolves the Parks and Recreation Board.

**SECTION II**

That Ordinance 9-03, codified in Sections 97.15 and 97.16 of the Fort Wright Code of Ordinances, enacted on July 9, 2003, and relating to the establishment of the Fort Wright Parks and Recreation Board, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

**SECTION III**

Any and all ordinances in conflict with this ordinance shall be, and hereby are, repealed to the extent of said conflict.

**SECTION IV**

If any part of this ordinance or its application is deemed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the City Council intends that such invalidity will not affect the effectiveness of the remaining provisions or applications and, to this end, the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

**SECTION V**

That this ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and shall be published under KRS §83A.060(9) and other applicable law. The ordinance may be published by summary.
